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Dior's perennial bag, the Lady Dior, became iconic the moment it appeared on the arm of Princess Diana. Now, for the fifth year in a row, the French house has granted a group of internationally renowned artists free rein to use its staple piece as a blank canvas. Among the class of creatives involved in this year's covetable Dior Lady Art collection? Vancouver-born, Puerto Rico-raised sculptor Gisela Colón, who translated her signature ethereal artistry onto two new handbags. OTHERWORLDLY INFLUENCES
As with much of her other work,
Colón looked to the skies for inspiration while designing her
bags, dubbed Stardust and
Amazonia. The hypnotizing
